
Technological Challenges

> META-RESEARCH: Building bridges to neighbouring technology fields



From Visions to the SRA




- **Vision Groups** bring together researchers, developers, integrators and (actual or potential, corporate or professional) users of LT-based products, services and applications (ca. 25 members each).
- **Feedback** to Vision Group results by the Technology Council, by the public at large, across the Vision Groups.
- The META Technology Council is preparing a vision paper, a comprehensive roadmap including individual roadmaps for key socioeconomic sectors, light-tower application visions.
- Finally, a **Strategic Research Agenda** will be presented by the Council (which will reflect the opinions and needs of stakeholders).
